## **TUSCAN BEEF STEW**

Recipe from Taste of Home

#### **Directions**



- 1. In a large shallow dish, combine flour and ½ tsp pepper. Add beef, a few pieces at at a time, turn to coat. Shake off excess.
- 2. In a Dutch oven, brown beef in 2 Tbsp. oil, drain. Remove and set aside. In the same pan, sauté the zucchini, onion, celery and carrots in remaining oil until tender. Add garlic, oregano, basil, and marjoram. Cook 1 minute longer.
- 3. Add broth, stirring to loosen browned bits from pan. Return beef to pan. Add the tomatoes, broth, sugar, and remaining pepper. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat. Cover and simmer until beef is tender, 1½ hours. Add tortellini and spinach. Return to a boil. Cook until tortellini are tender, about 7 to 9 minutes.

#### **Ingredients**

⅓ cup All Purpose Flour

1 tsp pepper, divided

1 lbs beef stew meat cut into 1 inch cubes

3 Tbsp Olive Oil, divided

2 medium Zucchini, cut into ½ inch pieces\*

1 large onion, chopped

3 cloves garlic, minced

2 Celery ribs, sliced

3 small carrots, sliced

11/2 tsp each oregano, basil, and marjoram

½ c beef broth

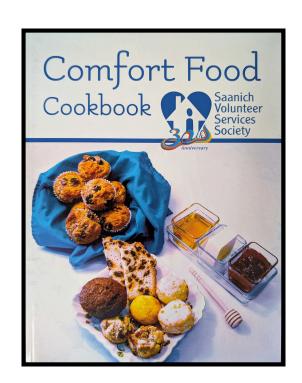
1 can (28 oz) crushed tomatoes

1 tsp sugar

1 pkg (9 oz) refrigerated cheese tortellini

1 pkg (6 oz) fresh baby spinach

<sup>\*</sup> If you aren't a fan of zucchini you can substitute with pumpkin, yellow squash, eggplant, Patty Pan squash, celery, carrots, or bell peppers.

#### **Better At Home Program**

In partnership with the United Way BC and Beacon Community Services, we help clients access support through Better At Home, a program that provides adults over 65 years with non-medical needs.



#### **Minor Home Repair**

Hanging pictures, putting up or taking down curtain rods, or fixing a stuck drawer, these are just a few of the things our volunteers can do. If our volunteers are unable to make the repair, they will refer to professionals. Please provide all items necessary for the repairs.



#### **Garden and Yard Work**

Pulling weeds, doing minor pruning, or tidying up the yard are all the ways volunteers help. We offer two appointments per person in each of two seasons. Clients provide the gardening tools. Please note that our gardeners are not able to climb ladders.

#### **Community Volunteer Income Tax Program**

If your income is lower (\$35,000 for individuals or \$45,000 for couples), live in Greater Victoria area and have simple taxes, our CRA approved volunteers will help you file your tax returns. Email for details at incometax@saanichvolunteers.org.

#### **Community Information & Referral**

Our team provides free, confidential Information & Referral assistance for clients and their families. If we're unable to meet a need directly, we'll connect you to trusted community services that can help.
